This is the last week of school and this last "Rooftop" for the year carries the latest list of donors to our "Raising a New Rooftop" Campaign. It's big, bigger, biggest because from October 24, 2003, our kick-off, until May 26, 2004, that number of donors has continued to grow.

Remember those wonderful increments! On January 12, there were 500 pledges/\$600,000. By February 2, they had become 547 pledges/\$650,000. At the end of the Winter Session as March began, 651 people had pledged \$701,000 and as school commenced for our Spring Session, 809 of us had pledged \$756,000, a number that grew to 859 and \$770,000 by mid-term. Now, the big news is that as of May 26, in just seven months, 981 students, faculty members, and staff have come together in common purpose for their mutual benefit. Surely in the remaining days of the session and the campaign, both of which will end on Thursday, June 3, those 19 pledges will come in and our campaign will reach one of its goals—1,000 people strong, "Raising a New Rooftop."

The bigger news can be found on the next few pages. There, in bigger print you'll find the names of everyone in our student body and on our faculty and staff who have pledged to date. Take a moment and find your name and verify, if you will, that we have listed you according to your wishes. In our previous listings space limited the size of our names in the Honor Roll of Donors. So this week the bigger news is that this time you won't need a magnifying glass to make sure you're properly credited for your philanthropy.

The biggest news has to do with the other of our dual goals, that one which had hoped to raise \$1,000,000 from this drive. Today, the "Rooftop" is thrilled to share the news of a large and generous gift! It is our pleasure to announce that one of your fellow students has made a substantial pledge to the campaign which now puts us over the top. What is even more touching than the generosity of this individual is the fact that this student does not want his/her name associated with this announcement, as "that would separate me from the others who have also given so amply."

So there you have it — the big, bigger and biggest all in one page. What a way to end the school year! If success breeds more of the same, then we know that our great achievement in one goal will only lead to success in the other — and soon.
